Hearing Conservation Program

Parent Consent Form

Hearing screening is conducted at your child's school as part of the Office of Public Instruction's Hearing Conservation Program. Pure Tone screening is mandated for students in grades K, 1, and 10. Students in other grades will also be screened if they are new to the school, on the annual hearing screening recheck list or referred by the school or parent/guardian.

Your child is not in one of the mandated test grades, but has been referred for the following reasons:

- ☐ New to the School
- ☐ Annual Recheck/ Known Hearing Loss
- ☐ Teacher or Parent Referral

If your child is absent, unable to complete the pure tone screening, or does not pass the pure tone screening, they will be referred for a hearing screen. An audiology assistant will be coming to the school for the hearing rescreen and, in addition to the pure tone screening may also conduct one or both of the following: Otoacoustic Emissions Screening, which is a measure of cochlear function that does not require the child to respond, and/or Immittance Screening, which measures the movement of the eardrum by putting positive and negative pressures in the ear canal.

Parent/Guardian signature gives consent for your child to have hearing screening, conducted during the 2024/2025 school year. This consists of an initial screening and may include a rescreen. Please contact the school if an ear-related medical issue arises and that information will be passed on to the hearing conservation program staff.

CHROMEBOOK USAGE AGREEMENT 2024/25

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the school has chosen to utilize Google Chromebooks as a tool to support student learning. Your student will now be regularly using this device in the classroom for assignments, science fair activities, collaboration, research, and many other school related instructional activities.

Chromebooks are inexpensive laptop computers that are designed to work with Internet based programs including Google Apps for Education. They require little maintenance, do not require costly programs to use but do need an Internet connection to be most effective. The school has already implemented Google Apps for Education, a free for education environment, that provides email, document creation and other tools, that works on any device with an Internet connection.

With your permission, your student will begin bringing home a Chromebook to use for school related work. We want you to be comfortable with home use and dialogue with us about any concerns you may have. We have made significant progress in the past couple of years with our technology based education services teaching best practices for Internet Safety, Social Media Use and Digital Citizenship. We have additional topics that will be covered throughout the school year. We have provided foundational learning about using Google Apps for learning purposes. Additionally, student activity on this device will be filtered for inappropriate content or use just as it is at school. You can help us ensure your student's success by encouraging your student to:

1. Handle the device with care
2. Store in a safe place at home
3. Log off the computer when not in use
4. Charge the computer in the evening
5. Use it for learning purposes only
6. Practice safe and appropriate Internet behavior
7. Not share the device with other family members

Rules and conditions each student must follow:

1. Use the device only when allowed by the teacher and as part of the learning process.
2. Connect only to the school wireless (filtered) network during the school day (no 3G/4G).
3. Be responsible for your Chromebook care and safety. Store your Chromebook in its case when not in use.
4. Do not access music streaming sites during school hours (bogs down the network system).
5. Listening to music while in the classroom will be up to each classroom teacher.
6. Students are only to be on educational sites while in the classroom. Playing games and watching videos (YouTube, Netflix, etc.) for leisurely purposes are not allowed during class.
7. Follow all current student handbook policies regarding usage of electronic devices.

If a student has his/her device taken away, the instructor will issue a disciplinary referral.

Consequences of unacceptable use:

1st offense: Loss of device for the day.

2nd offense Loss of device for two (2) weeks.

3rd offense: Loss of access to all open sites for an undetermined length of time (to be determined by the Superintendent). Students will only be able to access what is needed for school purposes. (Only the IT specialist will be able to do this, therefore, the student may be responsible for the cost of this at a rate of \$80/hour.)

4th offense: Loss of device for remainder of school year.

Students will be required to pay for repair or replacement of their Chromebook, case, or charger in the event of loss or obvious abuse. All damages, no matter the nature of occurrence, will be the responsibility of the student to whom the Chromebook was issued. Damage fees are as follows:

Screen damaged:	\$80
Charger lost/damaged:	\$35
Total replacement:	\$300

We are excited to bring this opportunity to our students and are confident they will learn to be responsible and effective technology users. Parents are asked to help monitor their child's computer use and support the guidelines stated above. Students will be required to pay for repair or replacement of his/her chromebook, case, or charger in the event of loss or obvious abuse. Please indicate your agreement and acceptance of responsibility for the device by signing and returning the agreement below to the office.

Your child will NOT be permitted to take their device home until we receive your signed agreement. Thank you for your support.
